

A Few Facts about Germany

- After the war, Germany was reestablished in 1949 as two separate states: the Federal Republic of Germany (FRG) in the West and the German Democratic Republic (GDR) in the East.
- With **reunification** in **1990**, the Federal Republic expanded to 16 federal states. (11 old and 5 new federal states)
- **Berlin** became the new federal capital and the seat of the federal government for the reunified Germany.
- Both, the federal government and the **16 federal states** (Laender) each have their own responsibilities.
- The responsibility for the areas of internal security, schools, universities, culture as well as municipal administration is a matter for the Länder.







Characteristics of Educational Federalism

The education system in Germany is characterized by the educational federalism:

- Schools and teacher education/training in Germany are **not centrally** regulated by Berlin.
- Schools and teacher education are sovereign tasks of the Laender and are under the supervision and legislation of the individual federal state.

What are the consequences?

- 16 different school systems, some of which differ considerably.
- 16 different teacher education systems that educate and train these teachers.
- 16 different ministries that are responsible.

Federalism needs Coordination: the Standing Conference I

Teacher education in Germany has a coordinating institution, the **Kultus<mark>m</mark>inisterkonferenz** (KMK):

"Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs of the Laender in the Federal Republic of Germany". Shortly: **Standing Conference**

- The Standing Conference was founded in 1948 and is the oldest ministers' conference in Germany.
- The Standing Conference plays a significant role as an instrument for the coordination and development of education in the country.







Standing Conference II

- All Needs of coordination and regulatory processes take place in the Standing Conference, which meets regularly.
 - e.g. Intermediate school-leaving certificates at the end of lower secondary schools
 - e.g. Uniform examination requirements for Baccalaureate examinations
 - e.g. Bologna Process (bachelor master system)
 - e.g. Recognition of qualifications and mobility
- Accepted results (KMK resolutions) are legally binding for all Laender.

Teacher Education System in Germany

Teacher education/training is divided into three phases. Each of the 16 federal states has its own legislation. So we have 16 different educational systems in Germany.

1) Course programmes of higher education at universities, including periods of practical training in school settings

2) Preparatory service in teacher training institutions at school

3) In-service training and further education.

In **Bavaria**, there is an individual course programme for each type of school. Within the selected course programme, teachers only qualify for that specific school type. Within the educational federalism, Bavaria structures its school system according to school types, not to school levels.

Every student has to write a thesis with a workload of 10 credit points during the final year. All credit points are admission requirements for the final examination, the First State Examination.

Phase 2 - Preparatory Service

- The study programme focuses on academic preparation and addresses professional skills.
- The preparatory service, on the other hand, is characterised by theoretically based practical school training.
- The instruments of training are:
- Attendance at the teacher training seminar (Studienseminar)
- Practical training in the class of the supervising teacher and own class
- Independent teaching in own class and other classes
- In-service training courses
- Instructors & trainers: Supervising teacher, seminar teacher





Phase 3 - Further Education and Training (quartenary sector)

The four different levels of further education and in-service training in Bavaria

1 Central in-service training and further education (land level: Bavaria as a whole)

Teacher Academy in Dillingen: **qualification courses** for executives and staff management e.g. head teachers or principals (several days)



Staff training of a particular school typ (several hours or a single day) e.g. primary schools

(school board level) e.g. Passau (local authority)

2 Regional in-service training and further education (**district** level) e.g. Lower Bavaria

Supporting course programmes of the teacher academy in all districts (single days): e.g. subject related, management, supervision 4 In-service teacher training (school level)

3 Local in-service teacher training

In-house staff training of a particular school (several hours or a single day)
